For more than 14 years, Radiant Hands has been connecting people like you to Tampa's greatest needs, extending your compassion to thousands of suffering men, women, and children. Together, we have fought against the suffering that accompanies disasters, broken the cycle of extreme poverty in our community in the Tampa Bay Area, lifted the yoke of despair for those fleeing from violence and oppression, provided hope to refugees, immigrants, and displaced people right here at home.

As we look back on 2019, we are grateful for the support we received from you, our volunteers and donors, as we continue our commitment to helping others. Inside the pages that follow you will read about how your support of our sponsorship programs during these critical times has changed the lives of many families who lost the ability to be self-sufficient on their own. Your support has also changed the lives of our immigrant and newcomer children through tutoring and mentorship programs and school partnerships. You will learn how the skill development and business establishment program you supported for the past three years has paved the way for future success. It was an important year for the promotion and funding of our Radiant Kitchens business: the first refugee women's established business in Tampa. ## MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

The Mercy USA grant has for three consecutive years supported the case management services at Radiant Hands. This represents the core of our quality services. Alhamdullilah, in 2019, Radiant Hands helped more people than ever before. Internal and external assessments reflect growing confidence in the constant quality of our work. Both grants have ramped up their response to protect vulnerable communities, from financial assistance to support sustainable development.



## Education





Radiant Hands has continued its educational mentorship by collaborating with Students Organize for Syria, a university organization which pairs tutors with students for tutoring on the weekends. The tutors also get the chance to develop personal bonds with the children. A survey was given out to students and tutors to assess the success of the program.

12 out of 22 students who took the survey gave a score of 5 for thinking they improved in school because of tutoring.

- 9/22 gave a score of 4 for thinking they improved in school because of tutoring.
- 15/22 gave a score of 5 for learning new information in tutoring
- 3/22 gave a score of 4 for learning new things in tutoring
- 19/22 gave a score of 5 for tutors and listened carefully to them
- 2/22 gave a score of 3 for tutors who listened carefully to them 20 tutors took the survey:
  - 19/20 gave a score of 5 for the experience of being rewarding.
  - 10/20 gave a score of 5 for believing they helped the students academically
  - 8/20 gave a score of 4 for believing they helped the students academically
  - The tutor results showed positive feedback, including optimism from the students, understanding the importance of mentorship, and the goodness of working with children and of teaching. One of the Radiant Hands' volunteers provided one-on-one tutoring for an adult lady (a refugee) pursuing her GED education.
  - One of the nine students who attended the SAT/ACT preparation tutoring took the SAT and succeeded with a score that will guarantee 75% of the State's grants.

# Skill Development & Business Establishment Programs









## Radiant Kitchens


Radiant Kitchens achieved many new milestones in 2019. The Radiant Kitchen ladies underwent several trainings and integrational classes. Radiant Hands collaborated with Project Prosper for a financial literacy class followed by a Micro-Enterprise Business class to strengthen their knowledge of financial institutions, learning about checking and savings, protecting assets, finances, and understanding payroll. Another part of their professional training was made possible by a business owner who offered the Radiant Kitchens chefs access to her kitchen spanning several months. This business owner's space was dedicated to accommodating the ladies' catering business. She organized a "Taste the Food" event to celebrate their certified status. The Chamber of Commerce of Wesley Chapel also attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony to mark the beginning of their catering business.

Another project was in partnership with the University of South Florida's Department of Anthropology. A team of USF students gathered recipes and narratives from the Radiant Kitchen ladies for a cookbook to be put together in a recipe book.

Multiple organizations and officials have awarded their tremendous success. In October, the Radiant Kitchens' team received a commendation from the Tampa City Council with an award presented by Tampa City Councilman Luis Viera.

The Radiant Kitchens project is proudly implemented and sponsored by a grant from Islamic Relief USA. Islamic Relief has sponsored our business establishment program for refugees by providing financial support to buy major equipment that propelled them towards a more empowered and stable life.





# Integration

Radiant Hands continued working on facilitating the process of integration by working with newly arriving families, partnering them with a volunteer, and communicating with them each week to provide food and/or household cleaning supplies. If additional needs were identified during these interactions, Radiant Hands responded with translators, transportation for appointments, and assistance with school registration. Radiant Hands aids numerous families for medical and school appointments and meetings.

Radiant Hands continued in providing the Financial Literacy class to a new group of refugees and non-refugees in collaboration with Project Prosper.

The second English Dialogue class took place and three ladies continued the class with an improved level of conversation.

Radiant Hands, several volunteers, and active lecturers planned for a women's camp for 2019. It included some games and interactive activities and began with some spiritual guidance. It was conducted weekly for two hours, covering different social and educational topics, such as:

- Driving permit class
- Obesity and overweight
- Anxiety problems
- Checking and savings (Project Prosper)
- Health and hygiene









# Sponsorships



The various sponsorship programs have been strategically developed by Radiant Hands in order to best face the challenges presented to the most vulnerable in our communities. The main goal of these sponsorship programs is to help our community members gain access to means to become self sufficient, as well as provide the necessary amount of support needed during these families' critical times of strife.

#### Family Sponsorship:

Under the on-going assistance for families, Radiant Hands covers the basic expenses for seven families eligible for the on-going sponsorship program. Throughout 2019, the seven families were sponsored by our generous donors and sponsors,



#### Medical & Dental Care:

Radiant Hands continues to coordinate appointments for refugees for medical and dental care that is not covered by their Medicaid plans. Radiant Hands has also facilitated appointments and set up and provided transportation and translation for numerous doctor and dental appointments. In addition, Radiant Hands assisted families to receive dental treatment through the agreement with some dentists who provided at least a 50% discount. The remaining balance was sponsored by an Islamic Relief USA grant.

## Counseling

In order to empower women and families to achieve independence and build a healthy life, the staff in the counseling department work diligently with families to provide much-needed services. We have provided counseling services to women, teens, and the elderly from diverse religious and ethnic backgrounds. Our counselors are trained in both individual and family therapy. As we continue to support our clients and their families, we also realize the importance of meeting the needs of the community at large. These services are available by appointment and our counselors work hard to meet the needs of all.







This year, we were able to host several workshops for our clients and the community at large. These interactive sessions were highly attended. Radiant Hands was pleased to have programs that were geared towards women's biological, environmental, and psychosocial challenges.

Our counseling services are supported from one of our longtime partner organizations, Mercy-USA. Radiant Hands is pleased to receive a grant from Mercy-USA for three years. Their generosity is greatly appreciated.



# Awards & Media Coverage



Radiant Hands received a certificate of appreciation from Refugee and Migrant Women's Initiative, Inc. (RAMWI) in grateful recognition of Radiant Hands' continuous service and support.

Radiant Hands, represented by its Director, received a Certificate of Appreciation for the outstanding dedication and service to the Tampa Bay Refugee Task Force and the Refugee Committee.





The amazing ladies of Radiant Kitchens were awarded a "Making a World of Difference" award at the World Refugee Day celebration at Pinellas Technical College in St. Petersburg.

The Radiant Kitchens ladies also received a commendation from the Tampa City Council to honor and celebrate their new catering business.



# Awards & Media Coverage

Radiant Hands' Director and Radiant Kitchens' coordinator were interviewed by the Tampa Bay Times for an article that was published in July. The reporter also interviewed the Radiant Kitchens staff and considered this project a big success in the refugee community. The article highlighted Radiant Hands' work in bringing these ladies together, organizing the catering business, empowering the ladies with proper certifications and trainings.



Radiant Hands was very honored to receive the Empowerment Award from our wonderful community partner, Project Prosper. We are very grateful for all their help in facillitating the financial literacy classes for many of our clients.

USF Mass Communications students covered the "Feels Like Home" Refugee Interfaith Thanksgiving. This was the second year for Radiant Hands to organize this event in collaboration with several faith based organizations, the Tampa Bay Refugee Task Force, and many community volunteers.

# Outreach & Community Engagement



A beloved Radiant Hands Executive Committee Member, Sabahat Khan, coordinates monthly food drives for families. Packages contain non-perishable items, and throughout the year, meat is also distributed. We appreciate her efforts!

In addition, furniture, kitchenware, and other household supplies were collected and Radiant Hands keeps it in storage and distributes them as needed to all clients.

Additional close community partners to Radiant Hands are CAIR and Hyde Park United Methodist, and Palma Ceia Presbyterian Church. Together, Radiant initiated a hygiene and sanitation drive with items like laundry detergent, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, toilet paper, spray cleaners, and dish soap.

An Interfaith Thanksgiving was hosted with the efforts of many faith-based organizations such as CAIR, Lutheran Services, Palma Ceia Presbyterian Church, Hyde Park United Methodist Church, The Presbytery of Tampa Bay, Congregation Beth Am, and the Tampa Bay Refugee Task Force alongside Radiant Hands. The event was filled with multicultural performances, speeches, food, and prayers in order to create a more welcoming environment for newcomers.



# Outreach & Community Engagement



Radiant Hands partnered with the Muslim Women's Organization of Tampa Bay for a Toy Drive, a Shoe Drive, and received twenty \$50 Walmart gift cards from a generous donor handed out at the Eid Bazaar.

In collaboration with ICNA RELIEF and the support of the Muslim Women's Organization of Tampa Bay and the Muslim Girls Scouts, Radiant Hands distributed over 100 book-bags with all different kinds of stationeries for all grade levels during the back to school season.




### Our Volunteers
